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THE ITINERARY

Day 1 Cairns - Herberton Historic Village - Malanda (approx. 80km day)

After an early morning departure from selected accommodation, your holiday begins, travelling up the Gillies Range to the Atherton Tableland. Enjoy a stop at Lake Barrine, a beautiful crater lake formed 17,000 years ago, for a short walk to the Twin Kauri Pines, before travelling on to Herberton.

Explore the Historic Village of Herberton, an open air museum where you can delve into the folklore and romance of yesterday's Australia. Sit in the schoolhouse. Stand at the bar of the pub. Enjoy a latte in the Bakerville Tearooms. The award-winning attraction is more than a vintage precinct – it's a tangible buzz of things past with over 50 original buildings with intact interior displays, original machinery and vehicles, plus thousands of antique items and period memorabilia.

In the late afternoon continue to the town of Malanda and settle into the Malanda Lodge, situated on 11 acres of manicured tropical gardens. All rooms have ground-level balconies and views to enjoy the tranquillity, or maybe spot their resident platypus family in the large pond. Malanda is well known for its rainforest walks, panoramic views, wildlife and a very successful dairy industry. It is also home to the heritage-listed Majestic Picture Theatre, known as the oldest continually-operating cinema in Australia.

Day 2 Malanda - Savannahlander Train Journey - Georgetown (approx. 300km day)

An early start sees us travelling west on the Kennedy Highway towards Mount Surprise, where we will enjoy lunch with a snake show. Afterwards, travel aboard the historic 'Savannahlander' train as it tracks towards Einasleigh. There is enough time to have a beer in the pub or head down and check out Copperfield Gorge before the train departs for Forsayth. From here, travel on to Georgetown where we stay overnight. Georgetown is a pleasant, sleepy little town on the Etheridge River which is surrounded by rich beef cattle country and some of the best gemstone areas in Queensland.

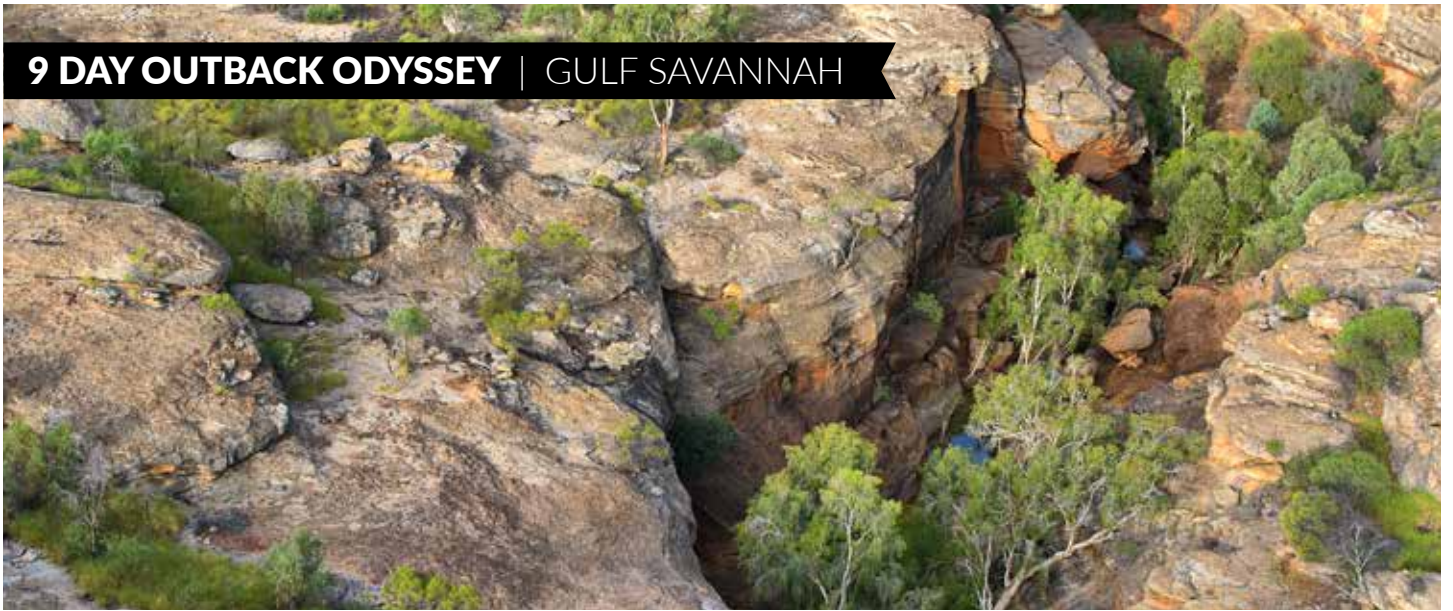
Overnight: Latara Motel, Georgetown

Meals included: Breakfast;Lunch;Dinner

Day 3 Georgetown - Karumba (approx. 370km day)

Enjoy a morning stop on the shore of Croydon's Lake Belmore before heading Normanton for lunch. Here you can check out its famous landmarks: the 'Purple Pub', historic Burns Philp General Store and a replica of Kryas, the 8.63m crocodile. Continue on to Karumba on the Gulf of Carpentaria to enjoy a spectacular Gulf sunset on a cruise. Overnight in Karumba, a popular fishing destination and industrial port on the banks of the Norman River. Each winter, anglers from all over Australia arrive to try their luck in the fish-rich waters of the Gulf.

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THE ITINERARY

Overnight: The Karumba Lodge, Karumba

Meals included: Breakfast;Lunch;Dinner

Day 4 Karumba - Leichhardt Falls - Burketown - Lawn Hill National Park (approx. 500km day)

Back through Normanton this morning and a poignant visit to Burke & Wills Camp #119, the most northerly campsite of the ill-fated expedition of 1860. Across the vast 'Plains of Promise' to Leichhardt Falls where you may see the beautiful plunge waterfall (rain dependant) and then stop in the Barramundi capital of Burketown for a quick visit. Continue on to Adels Grove in the Lawn Hill National Park, where we spend two nights amidst the glorious outback.

Overnight: Adels Grove, Lawn Hill National Park

Meals included: Breakfast;Lunch;Dinner

Day 5 Lawn Hill National Park

A relaxed day enjoying Lawn Hill National Park, a spectacular oasis set amid the spinifex clad Constance Range. Enjoy a cruise that offers an up-close look at the Lawn Hill gorge and a stunning view of the Indarri Falls. The gorge is a haven for wildlife, not to mention a birdwatcher's paradise. Don't forget your camera! Swimming or paddling a canoe (optional) up the gorge is highly recommended. Return to Adels Grove this afternoon.

Overnight: Adels Grove, Lawn Hill National Park

Meals included: Breakfast;Lunch;Dinner

Day 6 Lawn Hill - Normanton (approx. 450km day)

This morning depart Adels Grove, with the first stop at the World Heritage-listed Riversleigh Fossil Fields, a

paleontological treasure trove recording the history of Australia's mega-fauna of 20 million years ago. Enjoy lunch at Gregory followed by a short break at remote Burke & Wills Roadhouse before travelling on to Normanton. Enjoy the night in Normanton.

Overnight: The Gulfland Motel, Normanton

Meals included: Breakfast;Lunch;Dinner

Day 7 Normanton - Gulflander Train Journey - Cobbold Gorge

This morning we depart from Normanton's famous Railway Station, known for its Victorian architecture. Climb aboard the historic 'Gulflander RM93' train for a ride through the savannah landscape across the Norman River to Critters Camp. Continue on to Black Bull Siding, then the old gold mining town of Croydon and its Historic Precinct. This afternoon visit Georgetown and Forsayth on our way to Cobbold Gorge, where we stay tonight.

Overnight: Cobbold Gorge

Meals included: Breakfast;Lunch;Dinner

Day 8 Cobbold Gorge - Undara Volcanic National Park

This morning enjoy a cruise on Cobbold Gorge's beautiful and secluded waterway, lined with spectacular carved Hampstead sandstone, some 135 million years old. Afterwards travel on to the famous Undara Lava Tubes in the Undara Volcanic National Park, a Savannah Guides Station. There's campfire entertainment after dinner before retiring to your accommodation.

Overnight: Undara Lava Lodge, Undara Volcanic National Park

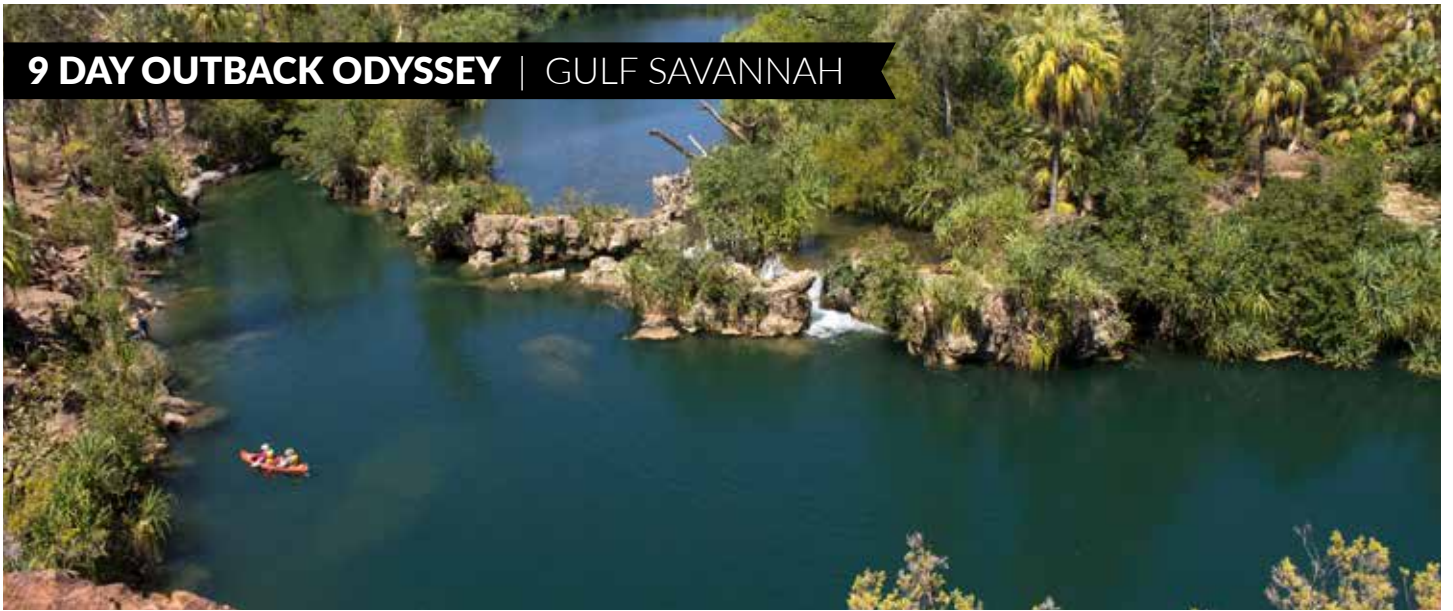

TOUR GUIDE VS. TOUR LEADER

Tour Guide:

Often locals with intimate knowledge of an area, its culture, and history. Their role entails providing commentary, routing the tour, and seeing that people have a good time. They are a licensed, qualified expert who supplies specific information on history, art, architecture and culture of the city/village/attraction in which he or she is guiding the tour. The guide meets the group at the required place and leaves the group at the end of the tour, they do not travel with the group.

Tour Leader:

An experienced person tasked with ensuring the smooth operation of tours, as well as providing practical support to passengers throughout the whole trip.



IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Their role primarily includes assisting with accommodation, transportation between locations, and communication with tour guides in each stop. A tour leader may provide general guidance around a city or village, and offer information on the place visited on the bus, however they are not required to have specific knowledge on art, architecture, or history. They are not allowed to provide a guided tour or commentary of a city/village/attraction once there and if caught doing so, can be fined.

Please note: Tour leaders/guides are not a standard inclusion in all travel offers. Tour leaders/guides will only be made available when particularly required to enhance the experience of the destination featured.

CLIMATE & AVERAGE TEMPERATURES

Karumba

The Karumba lies on 4m above sea level Karumba has a tropical climate. In winter, there is much less rainfall in Karumba than in summer. This climate is considered to be Aw according to the Köppen-Geiger climate classification. In Karumba, the average annual temperature is 27.1 °C | 80.7 °F. The annual rainfall is 876 mm | 34.5 inch. The driest month is July, with 1 mm | 0.0 inch of rainfall. With an average of 260 mm | 10.2 inch, the most precipitation falls in January. The warmest month of the year is November, with an average temperature of 30.5 °C | 86.9 °F. July has the lowest average temperature of the year. It is 22.0 °C | 71.6 °F.

Clothing & What to Bring

Casual gear is a must. You will need minimal changes of clothing. T-shirts, jeans, shorts, bathers, bath towel, a pair of rubber soled shoes or joggers, a warm jumper or jacket, hat, torch, insect repellent and toiletries. A track suit is most useful, too.

Meals

25 meals are included in the tour, for all other meals; lunches and dinners the tour leader (when available) will offer assistance with reservations, suggestions and directions to local restaurants. It is your responsibility to notify TripADeal of any dietary requests/requirements. Please note; we will do our best to meet your requests/requirements, however cannot guarantee that we will always be able to.

Luggage

You will be responsible for all your personal belongings whilst on the tour. With regards to luggage, you must carry your own luggage from the coach to the hotel room and back to the coach. The driver will assist with the uploading and off-loading of the luggage from the coach. Due to Government Workplace Health and Safety Regulations luggage cannot exceed 10kg. Luggage space is VERY LIMITED, so please restrict your luggage to ONE small SOFT travel bag (300mm x 300mm x 700 mm) and a small day pack per person. No hard suitcases or bags with wheels please. Any excess luggage can usually be stored at your hotel, or if your post tour accommodation differs, please arrange for your luggage to be transferred to your post tour accommodation.

OTHER

Fitness Level Required / Mobility

Our vehicles are not equipped with wheelchair access, so unfortunately our tours are currently not suitable for wheelchair users and those less mobile. All tours require that you are in a general good health. Gulf Savannah tours require a moderate level of fitness, as walks to locations may be on uneven ground. You will need to be able to carry your own bag to your accommodation.

Please note: If you have any mobility issues or if you are over 80 years of age a doctor's clearance may be required before we can confirm your booking. Please contact TripADeal for further information. If you have any concerns please consult your healthcare provider prior to purchase/travel.
