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THE ITINERARY

Day 1 Arrive - Uluru (Ayers Rock) - Kata Tjuta (The Olgas)

Make your own way to Uluru. The tour begins directly from Ayers Rock Airport where you will be met and transported the short distance to Uluru-Kata Tjuta National Park.

The afternoon is dedicated to exploring this extraordinary monolith, starting with a walk led by your guide, and hearing of the Indigenous law and religion (Tjukurpa) of this area. Learn about the art and culture of the local custodians, the Anangu people, and visit the acclaimed Cultural Centre where you can explore the displays and learn of the flora and fauna unique to this area.

Experience the changing colours of Uluru at sunset, complete with sparkling wine and nibbles and plenty of photo opportunities. This is a great time to kick back and contemplate the vastness of the desert while getting to know your fellow travellers. Afterwards settle in at the private camp, complete with the signature Endless Star dining experience before retiring for the night.

Overnight: Permanent Campsite

Meals included: Dinner

Day 2 Uluru / Kata Tjuta Sunrise - Kings Creek Station

Rising early, take a short walk to a lookout close to the campsite to view sunrise over Uluru and Kata Tjuta, without the hustle and bustle of the public viewing areas, before heading off to Kata Tjuta for a walk through the 'Valley of the Winds'. Afterwards, continue to Kings Creek Cattle Station for the second night's remote private bush camp, complete with flushing bush toilets and hot showers. With nobody else for miles, this camp has stunning views out over the George

Gill Ranges and gives you a real feel for the outback. Dinner around the campfire makes for a very social time with another night out under the stars. Tonight, listen for the sound of dingos howling in the distance while watching the desert sky light up above you.

Overnight: Permanent Campsite

Meals included: Breakfast;Lunch;Dinner

Day 3 Watarrka (Kings Canyon) National Park

Today head to Watarrka (Kings Canyon) for a mind blowing 6km walk through the towering walls, crevices and plateaus of Watarrka. Visit the Amphitheatre, Lost City and the tranquil 'Garden of Eden'. Afterwards travel a short distance to the next stop to enjoy a well-earned lunch followed by the opportunity to immerse yourself in an authentic indigenous cultural experience. Enjoy a leisurely guided walk with indigenous custodians while learning about bush tucker and the healing powers of bush medicine, and gain an insight into Aboriginal dot painting.

Late afternoon, start returning to Uluru for the final night in the outback, you'll have the chance to visit the camel farm (optional) to experience one of the oldest forms of transport in the desert before settling in for our last dinner together around the campfire. This evening you can also visit Bruce Munro's art installation 'Field of Light' (optional) or opt to stay back at camp and marvel at the clearest skies you can imagine.

Day 4 Ayers Rock Resort - Depart

Enjoy your final breakfast in the Outback before travelling to Ayers Rock Resort. Here you will have free time to explore some of the Resort facilities or participate in a range of free activities from Museum Tours to Bush Yarns before making your own onwards travel or boarding the airport shuttle to meet your flight.

4WD SAFARI INFORMATION

Luggage is restricted to 23kg per person in a soft bag or backpack. Due to limited space on the vehicle please restrict luggage to one day pack and one soft bag or backpack.

WHAT TO BRING

Torch, wide brimmed hat, sunscreen, insect repellent, water bottle (1.5 litres), walking shoes/boots, sleeping bag (if you prefer to use your own), toiletries, swimwear, towel, camera, comfortable and casual clothing for 4 days.

TOUR GUIDE

Often locals with intimate knowledge of an area, its culture, and history. Their role entails providing commentary, routing the tour, and seeing that people have a good time. They are a licensed, qualified expert who supplies specific information on history, art, architecture and culture of the city/village/attraction in which he or she is guiding the tour. The guide meets the group at the required place and leaves the group at the end of the tour, they do not travel with the group.

CLIMATE & AVERAGE TEMPERATURES

Uluru

The climate of Uluru and the Red Centre is one of extremes, with hot summers and cold winters.

Summer (December – February)

In summer average temperatures range from 20 - 35°C, and can soar to around 40°C. January is the wettest month with around 40mm of rainfall, however the climate is considered dry and arid for most of the year.

Autumn (March – May)

Autumn is one of the best times to visit Ayers Rock, with warm days and cool nights. Average temperatures range from 12 - 27°C.

Winter (June – August)

During winter, average temperatures fall between 4.8 - 20°C, with July being the

coolest month. Nighttime temperatures can drop below 0°C and thick frost on the ground can resemble a carpet of snow.

Spring (September – November)

In spring the weather begins to warm up with average temperatures between 13.8 - 30.6°C. It can bring spectacular thunderstorms and cool evenings.

Meals

Most meals are included in the tour, for all other meals; lunches and dinners the tour leader (when available) will offer assistance with reservations, suggestions and directions to local restaurants. It is your responsibility to notify TripADeal of any dietary requests/requirements. Please note; we will do our best to meet your requests/requirements, however cannot guarantee that we will always be able to.

Luggage

- You will be responsible for all your personal belongings whilst on the tour.

- There is a luggage limit of 23kg per person + a small carry-on day pack. Please, no hard-shell or plastic suitcases. Please pack the items you will need for the trip in the daypack to avoid having to access your main bag frequently.

OTHER

Fitness Level Required / Mobility

Our vehicles are not equipped with wheelchair access, so unfortunately our tours are currently not suitable for wheelchair users and those less mobile.

Please note: a reasonable level of fitness will be required. If you have any concerns please consult your healthcare provider prior to purchase/travel.

- The areas in which the tour operates vary greatly in terrain and weather conditions. Travellers may be required to undertake walking experiences up to 4 hours in duration in challenging conditions. Travellers must be aware that depending on which region the tour is visiting & the weather season in which you are travelling, you could encounter extremes of heat (40C+) or cold (-5C).

- The tour has two guides for the entire trip, for taking customers on walks with different fitness levels, where one guide can do longer

walks with the fitter members of the group, and the other guide can do a shorter walk for those less mobile.

- By law, it is required that customers advise TripADeal or our travel partners in Australia of any pre-existing medical conditions &/or Dietary conditions before they join the tour. Customers may also be asked at the time of each tour commencement to sign a liability waiver.

Gratuities / Tipping

Gratuities (tips) are not included in the tour price for services of the tour leader (when available) and driver throughout the tour. Tipping is optional and at the customers own discretion.

Sightseeing

Please note: In the event entrance to a site is affected by changes in operating hours or public holiday closures, your itinerary where possible, will be adjusted or an similar activity will be offered in its place (subject to availability).
